Staying informed about new code adoptions is essential for anyone working in construction, engineering, or development in the metro Phoenix, AZ area. Each local jurisdiction—such as Phoenix, Mesa, Tempe, Scottsdale, or Chandler—have all or are in the process of adopting new building codes this summer/fall. Contacting the local jurisdiction you are working within ensures you are working with the most current requirements, helping to prevent costly project delays, redesigns, or code compliance issues. It also provides opportunities for clarity on interpretations, inspections, and enforcement practices that may vary by city to city, or by county requirements. Proactively reaching out builds strong professional relationships with officials, fosters smoother project approvals and in turn value to your project. Communication is one major keys to success in 2025, knowing your codes and how those codes are enforced is another.
